



ADR: CARRIAGE OF DANGEROUS GOODS DRIVER TRAINING

LSCL provides training and examination facilities to fulfill the current legislative requirements for drivers of vehicles who carrying dangerous goods, to attend and complete an approved training course and pass an approved examination. The course is aimed at ensuring that the drivers understand:

- The nature of the dangers
- Safe handling of dangerous goods
- The action to be taken in an emergency concerning them
- Their duties under the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974
- Security considerations relating to dangerous goods
- Compliance with legislation

Course Contents

The course itself covers the subjects highlighted by the SQA and DfT syllabus and is divided into modules covering:

- CORE
- PACKAGES
- CLASS 2 GASES
- CLASS 3 FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS
- CLASS 4 FLAMMABLE SOLIDS
- CLASS 5 OXIDISING AGENTS/ORGANIC PEROXIDES
- CLASS 6 TOXICS
- CLASS 8 CORROSIVES
- CLASS 9 MISCELLANEOUS

LSCL is also a centre for the provision of the TANKER module and Petroleum Driver Passport

Training is conducted using registered and experienced instructors, using various training aids, videos, and personal protective equipment allowing the trainee to gain knowledge and practical experience in fire fighting, first aid, and emergency situation response. Duration of a course covering CORE, PACKAGES, and SEVEN CLASSES is three days with the examinations on the fourth day It can count as 21 hours towards Driver CPC. To undertake the TANKER module involves an extra 1.5days.

Examinations

Examinations take place on the last day of the training course. There is an examination for each module undertaken. These examinations are in either a written or online format, but are multiple choice, question and answer papers, which are both verified and marked by the Scottish Qualifications Authority

Certification

Certificates and Dangerous Goods Vocational Licences are issued by the DVLA Swansea.
